#### Membership Investment Computation:

Membership in LeadingAge delivers the combined power and collaborative engagement of two affiliated national/state associations. Dual LeadingAge/LeadingAge Missouri membership dues are based on a member's most recent FY Program Service Revenue (PSR)\*. LeadingAge (national) dues are determined by PSR dues bands. LeadingAge Missouri dues are 1.5x national dues. (Example: For member PSR less than \$1,900,000, Level 1 national dues are \$350. LeadingAge Missouri dues are \$525, for a total dues investment of \$875)

For Specific Service Provider Members, equal flat fee dues are leveled for LeadingAge and LeadingAge Missouri membership investment. (Example: Adult Day national dues are \$200. LeadingAge Missouri dues are \$200 for a total dues investment of \$400). For Affordable Housing members, PSR determines the national dues band amount. LeadingAge Missouri dues are 1x national dues. (Example: For an affordable housing member with PSR between \$1,900,000-\$4,400,000, LeadingAge/LeadingAge Missouri are \$1,000 each for a total membership investment of \$2,000)
